Unveiling Shirley & Walter

On November 6, a gorgeous and festive Saturday morning, members of the families of **Shirley Povich** and **Walter Johnson** joined with Montgomery Parks officials, County elected leaders, and Bethesda Community Base Ball Club leaders past and present to dedicate sculptures of two of Washington's most iconic sports figures. The sculptures of journalist Shirley Povich, for whom our ballpark is

named, and Walter Johnson, whose Big Train nickname our team carries with pride, were crafted by **Toby Mendez**, the sculptor who turned the legends of Birdland into bronze at Camden Yards.

Former *Washington Post* sports editor **George Solomon** spoke about his colleague Shirley Povich and was presented with a replica plaque for the newly named George Solomon Press Box. ESPN's **Tim Kurkjian** spoke about the career of Walter Johnson and received a replica of the Tim Kurkjian Sports Journalism Fellows (aka Big Train summer interns) plaque that will also be displayed near the door to the Solomon Press Box.

Ripken League Hall of Fame

Luke Adkins (BT 2006, 2008, and 2009/Mississippi State), super host mom Becky Crowley, and Hunter Renfroe (BT 2011 and 2012/Mississippi State) were inducted into the Ripken League Hall of Fame on November 7 along with inaugural Ripken League Commissioner Bill Spencer, Thunderbolt founder Dick O'Connor, and Maryland Orioles slugger Justin Bour.

Luke Adkins, named to the League All League Team in all three of his Big Train seasons, now serves as head baseball coach at Starkville High School in Mississippi. Becky Crowley serves on the board of directors of the Bethesda Community Base Ball Club and as Treasurer of the Ripken League. Hunter Renfroe, now a Milwaukee Brewer, led the Big Train to a national championship in 2011 and shattered Ripken League hitting records in 2012.

Big Train Manager **Sal Colangelo**, **Brian Dozier** (BT 2006/Southern Mississippi), and Big Train Founder **Bruce Adams** were three members of the 2019 inaugural class of the Hall of Fame along with **Cal Ripken Senior**, Youse's Maryland Orioles Manager **Dean Albany**, and Thunderbolts hurler **Brett Cecil**.

Cal Ripken League 2021 Champions



The Bethesda Big Train captured its fifth consecutive and ninth overall Cal Ripken Collegiate Baseball League championship on July 30 with a 4-0

road victory over the Alexandria Aces. The Big Train dominated the 2021 regular season with a record of 27-8 and ran the table in the playoffs beating the DC Grays twice in the semifinals and sweeping the Aces in the league championship series. Outfielder **Matt Thomas** (William & Mary) was named the league's offensive player of the year while two way player **Kemp Alderman** (Mississippi) received the league championship series most outstanding player award. *Perfect Game USA* rated left handed hurler **Grayson Hitt** (Alabama) as the league's top pro prospect. Manager Sal Colangelo named **Matt Thomas** the 2021 Big Train most valuable player; **Rocco Peppi** (Long Beach State) most outstanding hitter; **Grayson Hitt** (Alabama) most outstanding pitcher; **Ryan Metz** (Virginia Tech) most outstanding relief pitcher; and **Keith Torres** (Sacramento State) most outstanding defender.

Israel-Bethesda Friendship Game TEAM ISRAEL PREPS FOR OLYMPICS AT SHIRLEY POVICH FIELD



It was standing room only at Povich Field for the Israel-Bethesda Friendship Game on July 18, 2021 when the Big Train hosted the Olympic bound Israel National Baseball Team. Just days before departing for Japan, former major leaguers Ian Kinsler, Ty Kelly,

Ryan Lavarnway, and Danny Valencia faced off against the Big Train. The Big Train took a 7-5 lead into the last inning, but Team Israel won it with a dramatic home run. Team Israel split two exhibition games with Ripken League All Stars, winning at FNB Field in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania and losing at Ripken Stadium in Aberdeen, Maryland.

With support from our partners at the International Jewish Sports Foundation, Jewish Community Relations Council, Bender JCC of Greater Washington, The Jewish Federation, *Washington Jewish Week*, and the Embassy of Israel, the Friendship Game was a true celebration of community. Importantly, we were able to raise \$30,000 to support Team Israel in its historic trip to the Olympics.
