## Filling Your Baseball Void

HOW SIX COLLEGE STUDENTS HELPED BRIGHTEN YOUR LOCKDOWN SUMMER WITH THE Big Train Beacon AND bigtrain.tv

We decided from day one of regaining stewardship of Big Train baseball on June 1 that the fact that we couldn't watch baseball at Povich Field should not mean Big Train baseball would go dark for the lockdown summer of 2020. We obtained the rights to the *bigtrain.tv* domain name and set general manager **Chris Rogers** and his team of talented interns to work to bring you Big Train quality entertainment.

It started with "**NOpening Night**" on Friday June 5. We produced nearly 30 hours of programing on *bigtrain.tv* and five issues of our online magazine format *Big Train Beacon*.

After just a few weeks, we realized the interns deserved a more appropriate title. We turned to our Montgomery County neighbor and Walter Johnson High School graduate, ESPN's baseball guru Tim Kurkjian, to see if he might help. As he always does, Tim stepped up and allowed us to name our summer staff **Tim Kurkjian Sports Journalism Fellows**.





The first issue of the *Beacon* featured extensive coverage of our 2019 championship season by Chris Rogers. Issue 2 included an in depth look at how Big Train alumni were coping with the uncertainty of the Covid-19 era by Kurkjian Fellows **Patrick Sanderson** and **Noah Ziegler**. Ziegler profiled Tim Kurkjian's journey from Bethesda to the big leagues in issue 3 and 2019 Big Train pitcher **Kelli Jenkins** becoming the first woman to play in the Ripken League in issue 4. The final issue in August included a history of summer college baseball in the Washington-Baltimore region. Kurkjian Fellow **Alex Murphy** profiled the Big Train board members while Kurkjian Fellow

Erin Byard contributed stories on many of the Big Train's 25 greatest games.

Kurkjian Fellows **Shaun Salehi** and **Alex Drain** came to Bethesda this summer intending to reprise their roles in the Povich Field broadcast booth. When handed the lemon of a cancelled season, they made lemonade. Salehi teamed up with Big Train manager **Sal Colangelo** to produce eight sessions of **Talkin' Baseball** on Monday nights featuring Big Train coaches and alumni. Drain hosted **Top Ten Thursdays**, interviewing players, coaches, staff, and fans about the ten greatest games in Big Train history.

Sanderson produced **Safe at Home Tuesdays**, a series of eight interviews conducted by Big Train Founder **Bruce Adams**. Bruce's guests discussed summer college baseball and the lives of Hall of Famers Roberto Clemente, Negro League founder Rube Foster, Hank Greenberg, Walter Johnson, journalist Shirley Povich, and entrepreneur Bill Veeck.

# **Big Train in the Community**

### SUPPORTING THOSE ON THE FRONT LINES OF THE FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

Since our founding in 1998, the Bethesda Community Base Ball Club (BCBBC) has been about helping to build a stronger community. In our first 13 years, we raised \$600,000 to improve ballfields for kids from Germantown to Anacostia. Over the last decade, our **Nonprofits of the Night** program supported by the **Trawick Foundation** has allowed hundreds of community nonprofits to showcase their programs to Big Train fans. Our players have collected 17,289 pounds of food for the Manna Food Center as part of the Ripken League's annual **Feed the Hungry Challenge**.

Our newly reconstituted BCBBC realizes that our work in the community is more important now than ever, especially in this difficult Covid-19 era. On September 14, as a result of our successful summer fundraising, we were pleased to be able to donate

\$2,500 to support the essential work of the **Manna Food Center.** 

We named our first five Big Train Community Heroes in partnership with the Trawick Foundation this summer:



Jackie DeCarlo, CEO of the Manna Food Center; Sheryl Brissett Chapman, Executive Director of The National Center for Children and Families; Mark Bergel, Founder and Executive Director of A Wider Circle; Teresa Wright, a career Montgomery County Public Schools teacher and Board Member Emeritus of Identity; and Randy Schools, long time chair of the Big Train Booster Club now retired from a distinguished National Institutes of Health (NIH) career heading various NIH charities such as The Children's Inn at NIH.



This fall, we joined the **Nourishing** Bethesda coalition to fight food insecurity right here in the greater Bethesda community. The coalition includes St. John's Norwood Episcopal Church, Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce, Hyatt Regency Bethesda, Montgomery County Government, Bethesda-Chevy Chase Rescue Squad, and Nourish Now. On Friday October 2, Homer helped Nourishing Bethesda volunteers distribute boxes of food to 200 of our neighbors in need at the B-CC Rescue Squad.
